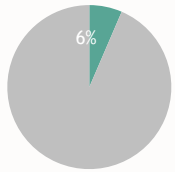

CARE REFERRALS

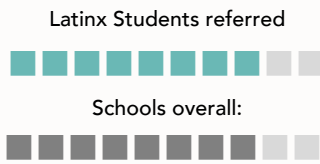
Crisis Assessment and Referral Evaluation (CARE) teams, with leadership from the school's Beacon Director, reviewed students' needs, referred them to appropriate services, and monitored their progress.

161 students were referred

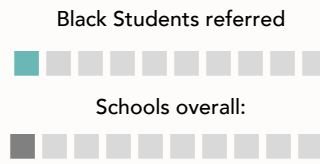


6% of the student population

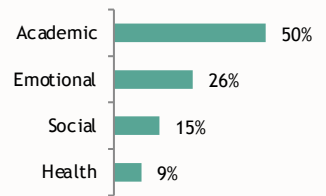
79% of referred students were Latinx

History of the Community Schools Initiative

On November 21, 2011 the San Pablo City Council passed a resolution to develop a San Pablo Full-Service Community Schools (FSCS) initiative. Through the establishment of full-service community schools in San Pablo, the City created the conditions for Contra Costa County (CCC), West Contra Costa Unified School District (WCCUSD), community-based organizations, local businesses, families, and community leaders to form a **strong partnership** to address the needs of students and families.

YOUTH PROGRAMS

Beacon Directors supported group activities like sports teams, student clubs, and leadership groups to create a positive **school culture and climate**. They also infused **health and wellness** into school activities.
