- Improved accessibility and efficiency for clerical tasks like signatures for City Manager and City Clerk through extensive review of documents and place holders for signature-required pages






GROUND FLOOR BUSINESSES ON 23RD STREET

 Development and investment along the commercial corridor.




23rd Street Commercial Corridor, San Pablo,

GROUND FLOOR COMMERCIAL SPACE USES


- 91 Total Ground Floor Storefronts

FINAL THOUGHTS

- 23rd Street is zoned as a Commercial Mixed-Use District meant for neighborhood-serving businesses
- Most existing businesses align with zoning goals, especially services and food establishments
- Compared to similar nearby commercial corridors like Solano or College Avenue in Berkeley, 23rd Street has fewer retail shops
- 23rd Street leans more toward service-based uses, with opportunities for more variety over time
