A BILL

To amend section 249 of the Immigration and Nationality Act to render available to certain long-term residents of the United States the benefit under that section.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Renewing Immigration
5 Provisions of the Immigration Act of 1929”.

1 **SEC. 2. REGISTRY.**

2 (a) IN GENERAL.—Section 249 of the Immigration
3 and Nationality Act (8 U.S.C. 1259) is amended—

4 (1) in the section header, by striking “**en-**
5 **tered the United States prior to January**
6 **1, 1972**” and inserting “**are long-term resi-**
7 **dents of the United States**”; and

8 (2) by amending subsection (a) to read as fol-
9 lows:

10 “(a) entered the United States at least 7
11 years before the application date;”.

12 (b) EFFECTIVE DATE.—The amendments made by
13 this section shall take effect 60 days after the date of the
14 enactment of this Act.

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
