Population surveyed: Community-at-Large

Sampling Error: ±4.5 to 5.8%

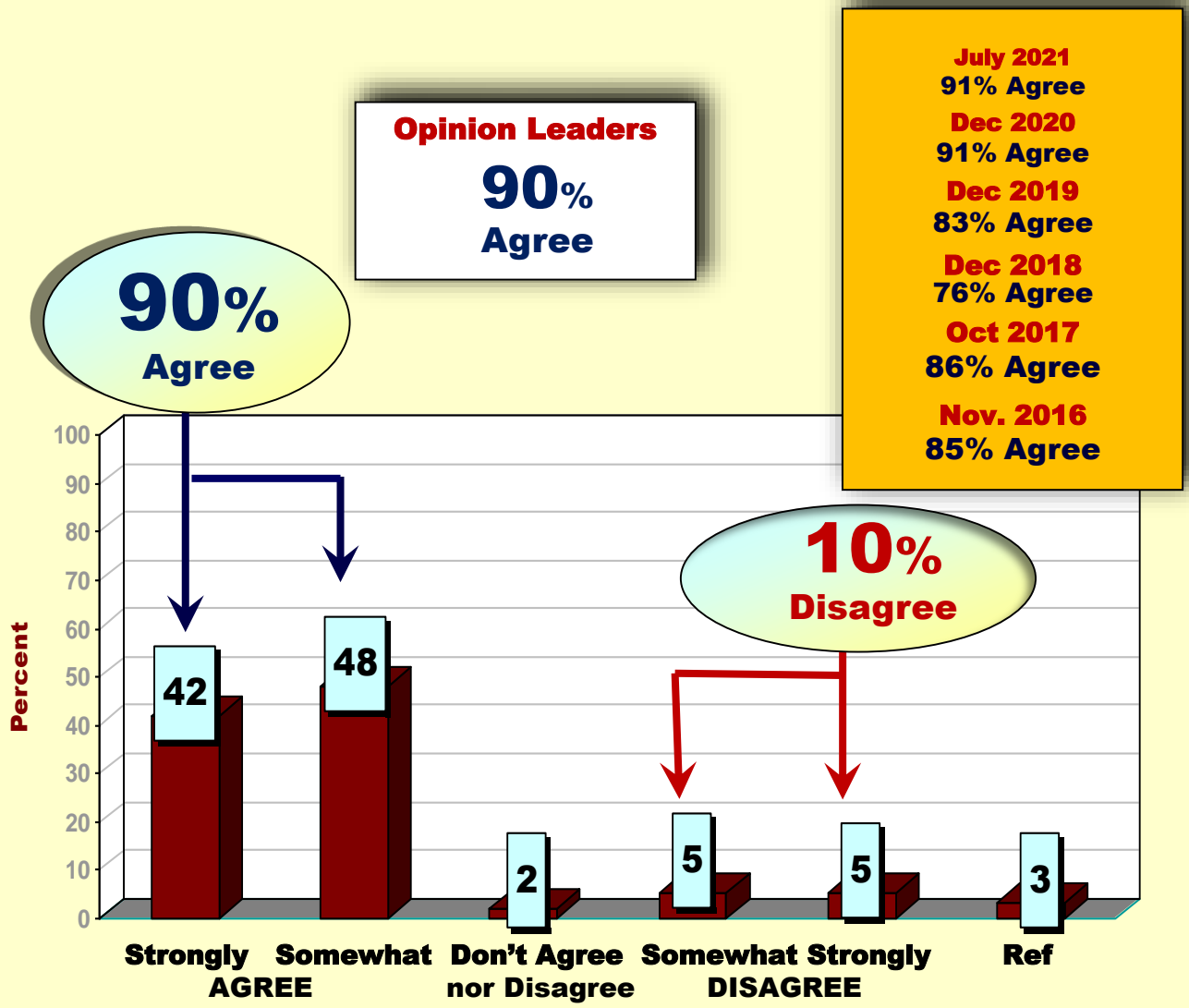
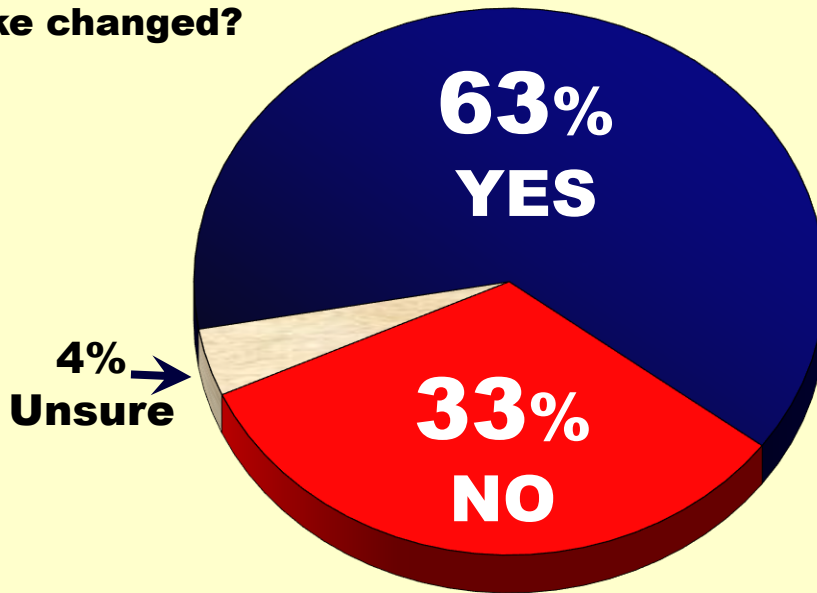

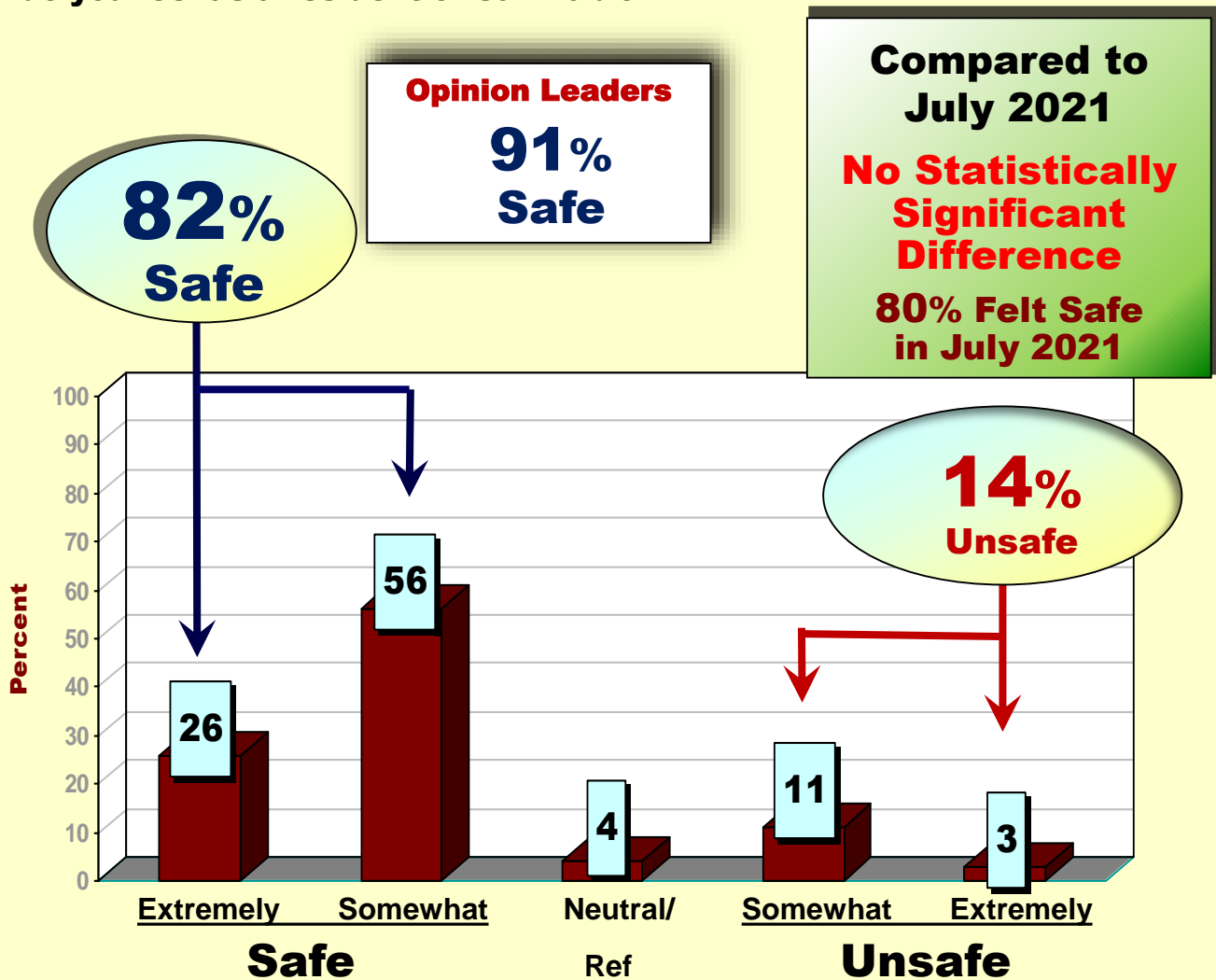


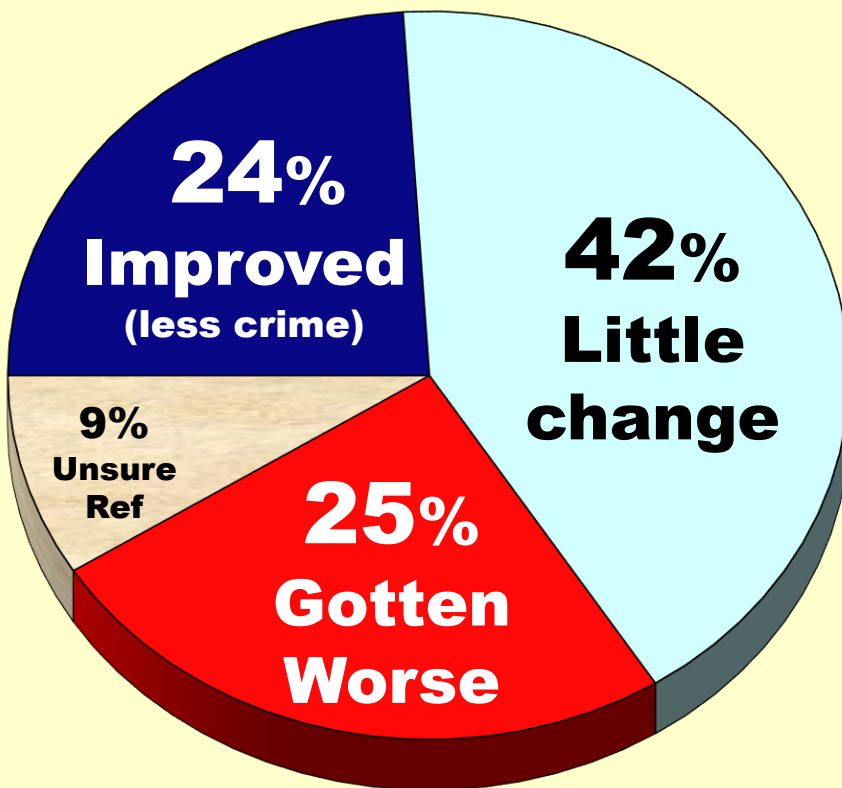

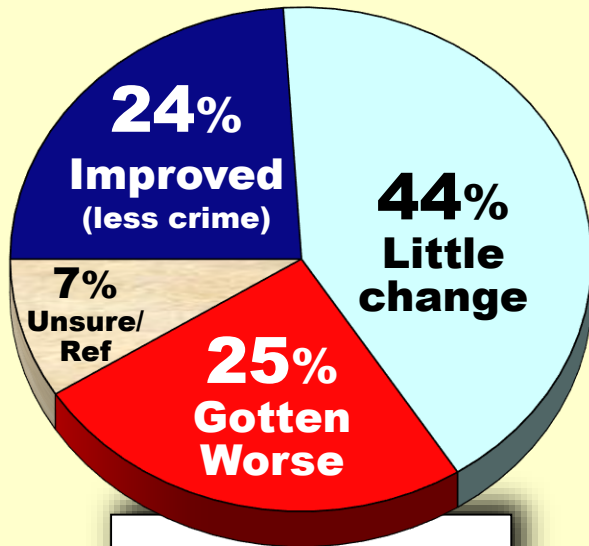

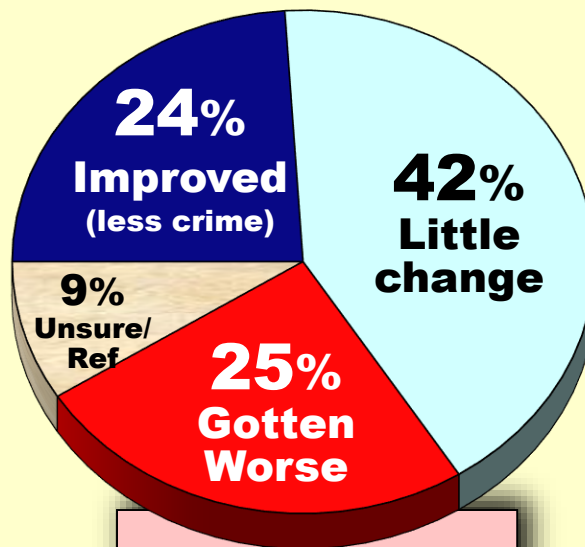

Question 4.0: How satisfied are you, today, with the level of service being provided to San Pablo residents through the City's Police Department?

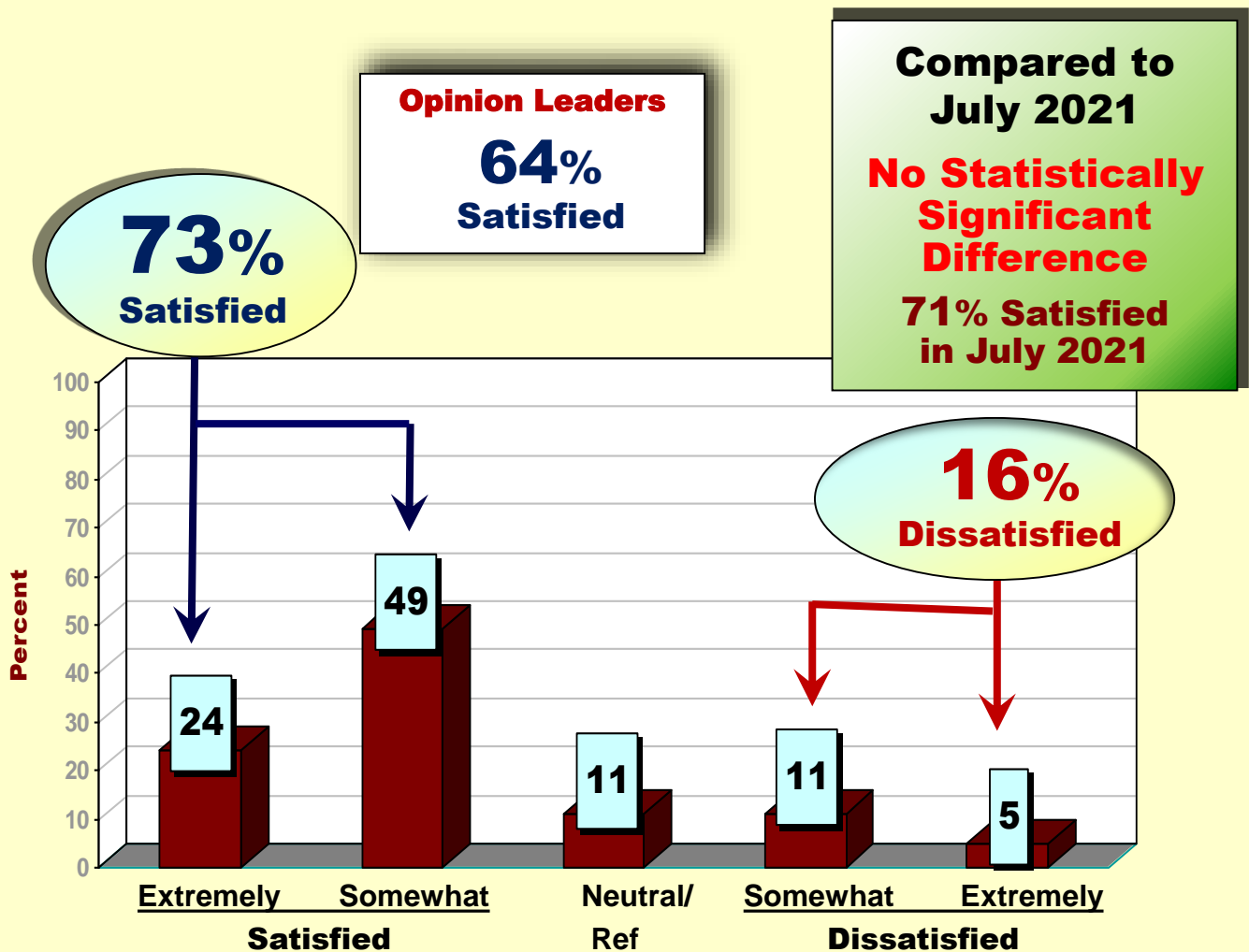

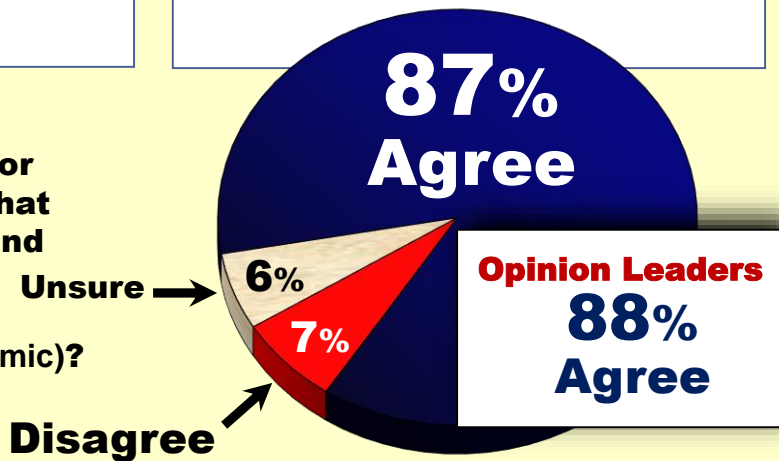

Question 6.1: Do you support the construction of a new Police Headquarters, including a Regional Law Enforcement Training Center?

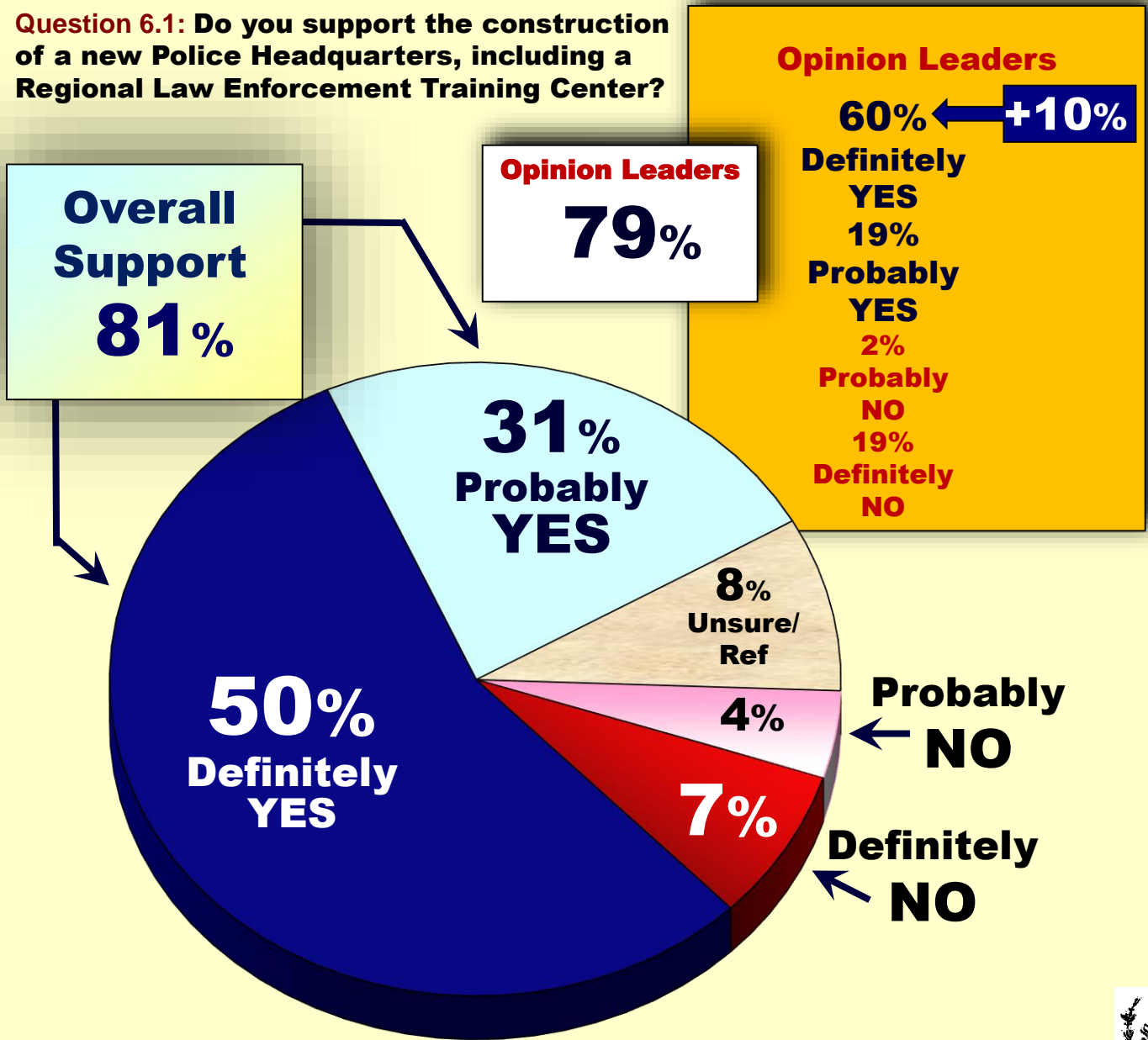
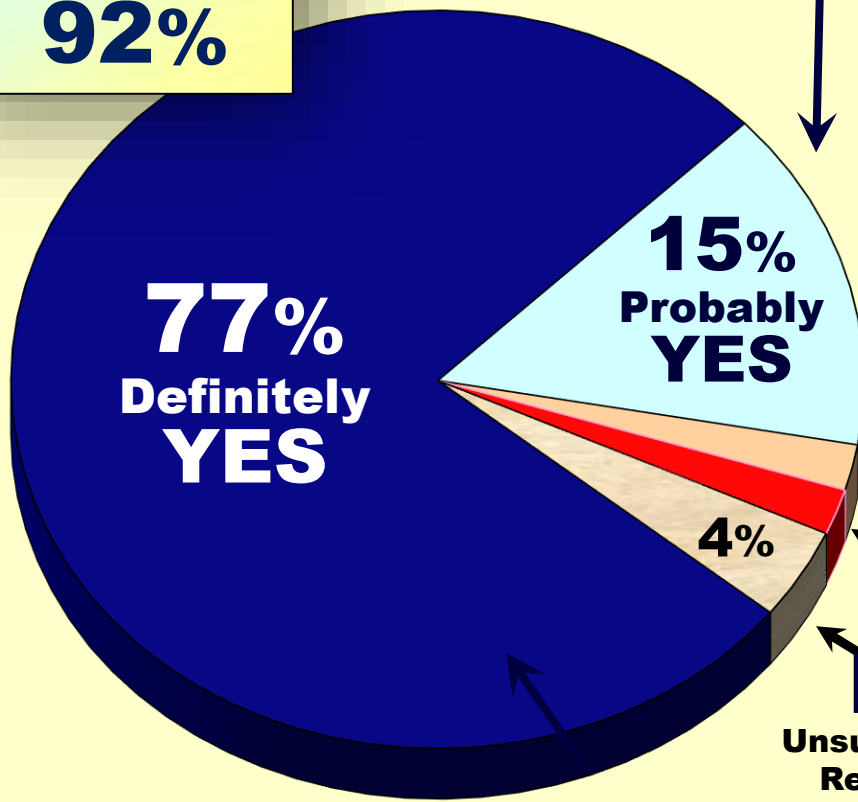

Question 9.0 Do you support the notion of creating a mental health deployment office for use by the City and the surrounding West County Cities?

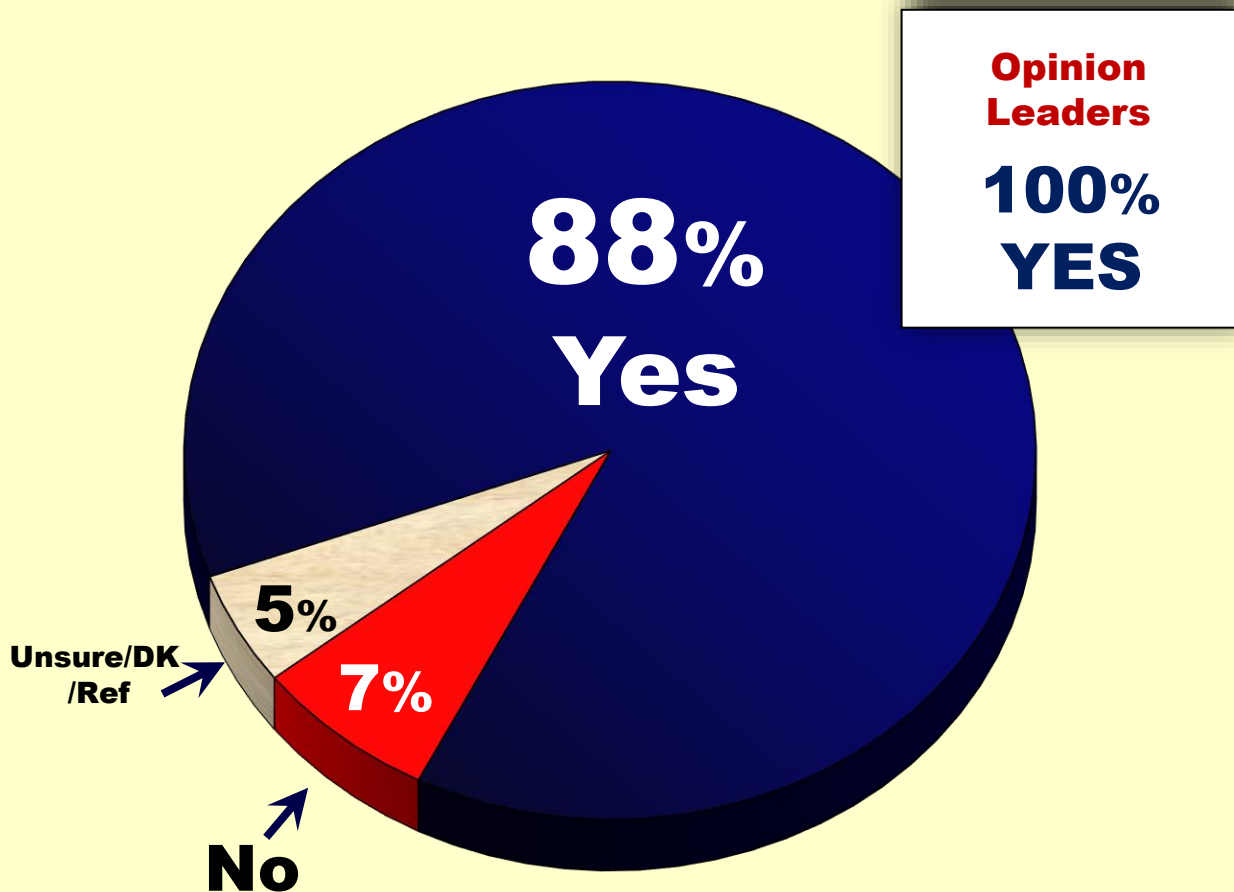

Question 10.0 What priority would you place on the **CORE Services Program (Help the Homeless)?**

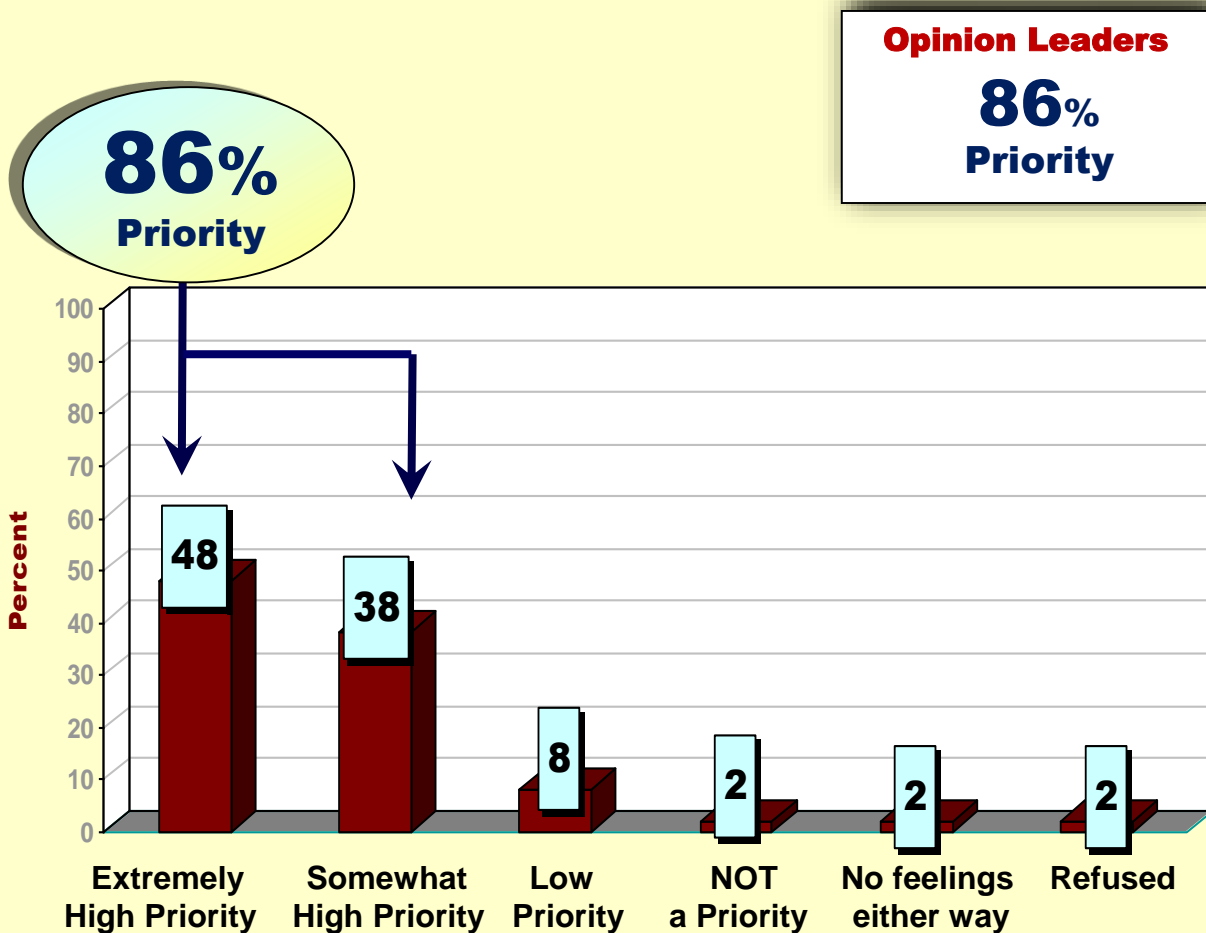

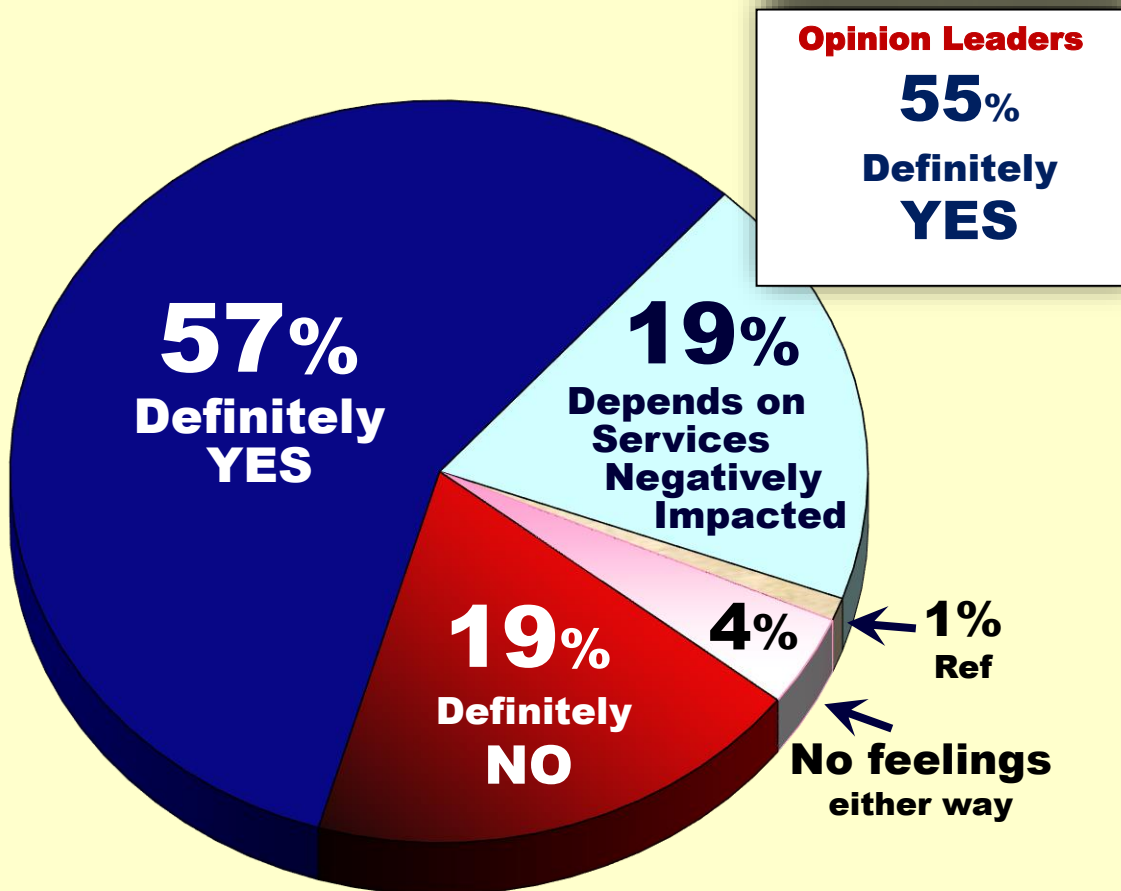

Conclusions/Next Steps

- 1. Overall, San Pablo residents continue to be ‘happy campers’**
- 2. Most San Pablo residents feel SAFE**
- 3. However, the collective perception among Opinion Leaders regarding certain issues (e.g., crime in the community) are softening**
 - Thus, there is a need to reach out to the community via the social media and through interpersonal communications to show how the Police Dept. is going above and beyond to keep community safe; inform residents about SPPD’s focus on various activities, programs and services; etc. etc. etc.
- 4. Huge support for:**
 - Police Department providing a host of programs/activities that focus on public safety
 - New police headquarters/regional training center
 - Creating Mental Health Deployment Office and continuing to support the County-wide A3 Program
 - CORE Services Program (helping the homeless)
- 5. Encourage WCCUSD to re-institute SRO’s on campuses**
