## **RESOLUTION 2016-139**

## RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SAN PABLO TO ACCEPT CITY OF SAN PABLO 2016 ANNUAL COMMUNITY SURVEY RESULTS FROM STRATEGY RESEARCH INSTITUTE, INC.; AND AUTHORIZE THE CITY MANAGER TO PROCEED WITH FEASIBILITY, PRIORITIZATION AND PLANNING FOR POSSIBLE FUTURE CITY-INITIATED FUNDING MECHANISMS

WHEREAS, Annual City Benchmark Survey, Municipal Broadband Fiber Optic Project, Measure Q Sales Tax Measure, and Funding Mechanism for Childhood Obesity Prevention Programs are all adopted policy items under the FY 2015-17 Council Priority Workplan, effective July 1, 2015; and

WHEREAS, the City Council authorizes an annual community survey to be conducted each year by Strategy Research Institute, Inc. (SRI) for purposes of civic engagement and community outreach to the community at-large and electorate to solicit feedback on a number of core values and policies being undertaken by the City for policy decision-making by the City Council; and

WHEREAS, in January 2016, an Annual Community Survey was completed for FY 2015/16 and the community at-large surveyed; data analyzed and interpreted, and summary findings and results prepared by SRI for public presentation to the City Council, including the review of three (3) r potential funding mechanisms for future policy consideration and evaluation by the City Council.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED the City Council of the City of San Pablo authorizes the following, as follows:

- 1. Authorize the City Manager to accept the summary findings and results of the 2016 Annual Community Survey from SRI, Inc.; and
- Authorize the City Manager to proceed with prioritization and planning for the following possible City-initiated potential funding mechanisms for further policy consideration and evaluation by the City Council in sequential order, as follows:
  - (1) Municipal Broadband Fiber Optic Project Funding Mechanism (O&M Annual Costs)
  - (2) Measure Q Sales Tax Measure Funding Mechanism (Extension beyond 2022)
  - (3) Childhood Obesity Prevention Funding Mechanism

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the foregoing recitations are true and correct, and are included herein by reference as findings.
