## MEASURE K OVERVIEW

## Measure K Special Sales Tax Overview

Proposal passed with a 71% "Yes" voter approval on June 3, 2014

### Purpose

- To ensure that Emergency Medical Services (EMS) continue to be provided out of San Pablo's Fire Station 70 by the Contra Costa County Fire Protection District (ConFire) after the closing of Doctor's Medical Center Hospital
- Fire Station 70 is one of the busiest stations in the District. In FY 2016/17, FS 70 responded to nearly 3,205 emergency medical calls

## Services are restricted to the following:

• Revenues generated can only be used for the "special purposes" identified in the ballot measure language: to fund the creation and operation of an EMS Squad at Fire Station 70

## TAX ADMINISTRATION & BUDGET

#### Tax Structure

• 1/4 cent sales tax levied in perpetuity (current total rate is 8.75%)

#### Tax Administration

- All Transactions and Use (Sales) Taxes are administered by the California Department of Tax and Fee Administration (CADTFA)
- CADTFA remits taxes monthly with "true-ups" happening quarterly

#### **Budget Overview**

- Measure K revenues were first received in January 2015
- EMS Squad first became operational in May 2015
- FY 2016/17 is the Squad's SECOND full year in operation

## FINANCIAL SUMMARY

- Measure K revenues are budgeted conservatively at \$650,000 annually
- EMS contract with ConFire costs \$1.2 million annually for the 1<sup>st</sup> three years.
- Contract increases to \$1.5 million annually in FY 18/19

## PROGRAM ACCOMPLISHMENTS

## Accomplishments

- Squad 70 is staffed 24/7 by at least 1 paramedic and 1 paramedic or EMT
- In FY 2016/17, the EMS Squad responded to 3,898 emergency calls, including fractures, respiratory issues, fainting, illness, auto accidents and fires
- The EMS squad relieves pressure at Station 70, thus allowing Engine 70 to respond to other fire emergencies
