CARE REFERRALS

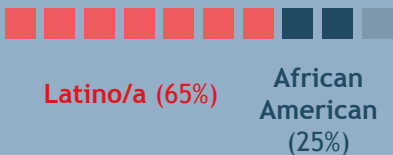
Crisis, Assessment, Referral, Evaluation (CARE) teams, led by the school’s Beacon Director, review students’ needs and refer them to appropriate services, such as academic, mental health, or emotional services.

540 students were referred

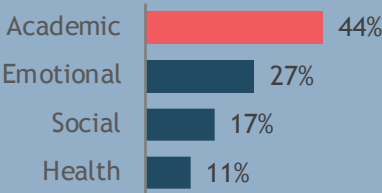


10% of the student population

YOUTH LEADERSHIP

San Pablo Community Schools focused on engaging families, and especially African American families in line with the District initiative, by hosting events such as family paint night and campus beautification day.

San Pablo Community Schools, spearheaded by Beacon Directors, trained staff on restorative justice and trauma informed practices, in order to support the trauma inflicted communities in which they serve.

Beacon Directors at San Pablo Community Schools created leadership opportunities for youth through affinity programs, youth organized events, and peer mentoring.

LITERACY

In San Pablo 42% of students are near or above grade level literacy benchmarks, compared to 55% for the District. San Pablo Beacon Community Schools promoted literacy through events such as literacy nights with youth and their families, and by instituting reading challenges. Additionally SPBCSI funded summer programming with the focus of improving literacy.
