Sound Minds falls in the "Active Living" category of HEAL. Sound Minds students are actively engaged in music-making, including circle songs and dance elements in chorus class, clapping and other percussive actions in rhythm class, and developing the muscle memory and physical strength required to play a string instrument, either violin or cello.

Sound Minds fits After-School Programming, Partnership with WCCUSD, and addresses Youth Programs/Services, including the Full Service Community Schools (FSCS) Initiative as it provides an after-school program and is increasing reading proficiency. Sound Minds directly fits the policy item of Youth Events in the Fine and Performing Arts.

<u>Please provide a description of the program(s), event(s) and/activity, including date(s).</u> If you were not able to complete or achieve the goals outlined on your grant application please provide a brief explanation:

Sound Minds ran for 12 weeks in the fall (Sept.—Dec. 2018), and will finish its 14-week spring semester in May 2019. Classes take place after school 3 days a week for 2.5 hours each day and include musicianship, rhythm, lessons in violin or cello, full ensemble, academic enrichment, and mindfulness. Top level students attend a California Symphony rehearsal as well as have a member of the Orchestra lead the group in a workshop. Students also received mentoring from high school orchestra students at Dougherty Valley High School, which is led by one of the musicians of the California Symphony. Each student receives more than 200 hours of music education at no cost to them or their families.

100% of the grant funds were used to serve San Pablo residents—students and their families who benefit from the Sound Minds program and related community events. The total cost to operate the program is nearly \$140,000 annually at this one school.

Sample Lesson Plan: Sound Minds Level II Strings

Violin Instruction with Mr. Sego Fall Semester, Week Four

Level IIs are mostly 3rd graders who have been in the program one full year; Level II's in the Fall semester have completed 1 semester of basic musicianship and 1 semester in violin instruction; this 35-minute class takes place twice a week.

20 Minutes Technique Training and Exercises

Warm up: Schradieck exercises #1 - 4

Discuss how to strengthen fourth finger and improve left hand coordination

Add new finger pattern for C major scale – demonstrate and assess

#126 Exploring Naturals

#127 The Natural Explorer

#128 Exploring the C Major Scale *ADD HOOKS AND SLURS

Individual slur exercise (this will be done again with hooks in a future lesson)

#129 Exploring Arpeggios

Discuss arpeggios – remind of "Scales and Arpeggios" song from Chorus class

#130 Exploring Thirds

15 Minutes Repertoire Rehearsal

Barcarolle from Tales of Hoffman (Offenbach, arr. Meyer) Measures 1-40:

Review measures 1-8 down the row Play measures 9-24 along with Mr. Sego

Discuss historic context: from an opera Offenbach composed, based on ETA Hoffman's stories

Discuss linguistic context: Barcarolle from Italian word for boat, folk songs sung by gondoliers

Full ensemble plays mm. 1-40 without Mr. Sego

Desired Outcomes and Assessment Measures

SWBAT (Student Will Be Able To):

- Demonstrate a C major scale individually (review)
- Show improved left hand coordination, especially fourth finger
- Play #128 with hooks and slurs with group, commit to practice this at home to be assessed individually in future lesson
- Play alone showing slurs in uneven patterns as assigned by Mr. Sego (example: slur 2, bow 1 separately) on E, A, D, or G
- Describe how an arpeggio differs from a scale
- Correctly finger and hum #130 while Mr. Sego plays
- Explain where the Barcarolle piece comes from
- Play measures 1-40 in group without stopping
