Our internship program for youth meets the Build a Healthy Community priority, and addresses very specifically the priority 100.3. Foster College And Career Readiness, Education, Youth Leadership. Yooth receive 100 hrs of education and training in STEM and employability skills. It also promotes 10.2 Continue Development Of Multi-Ethnic Diversity And Awareness In City Programs And Services, since we encourage diversity and our participants are 80%+ youth of color, a majority female. Our program staff is trained in Equity and Inclusion principles, appled to this program.





The goal: to increase the percentage of students to use alternate transportation methods, specifically biking, to get to and from school. Armed with the knowledge the Bay Area Quality Management District (BAAQMD), the Center for Climate Protection (CCP), and others so generously shared with them, interns began developing a power point presentation.

Kennedy H.S. Earth Team Sees Massive Student Support For Bike Rally



The interest level of students at Kennedy H.S. (JFK) was high, and Earth Team definitely was more than happy to oblige and cater to it. March 18th marked JFK's first bike rally! The team worked tirelessly for weeks talking to school administration to get approval, creating flyers and posting them all over campus, partnering up with supportive teachers, staff, and Rich City Rides, working through the logistics of curating an event, on top of their appointed Rumrill litter assessments.



The traffic at the booth JFK and Rich City Rides (RCR) set up was admittedly slow at first, but once students got their lunches (and Earth Team interns passed flyers out), students came trickling in. RCR took the opportunity to sign up students for their bike club initiative they're starting on the JFK campus, and to educate students on how they can earn a free bike.

City of San Pablo - Air Quality and Human Health Activities July 2018 - June 2019

Rush Creek Bike Ride - 7/1/18

Bike ride, including bike safety and education training, with Rich City Rides, with 11 interns in attendance.

On-Campus Transportation Surveys - Fall 2018

23 student interns collected transportation use and distance as well as asthma incidence data from representative samples of their campus populations. 343 Richmond High and Kennedy High students were surveyed.

Air Quality and Human Health Curriculum - 10/2/18

23 interns participate in activities to exemplify the physical responses to asthma and poor air quality to provide more significant understanding of intersection of health and environment in relation to active transportation etc. JFK Earth Team also developed a model to connect their work with litter/ marine debris to air quality by developing a draft model of litter offsets of miles of transportation transitioned to active or alternative, called WOTS (Waste Off The Street).

Transportation and Air Quality Data Analysis - 11/13/18 - 12/10/18

23 interns cleaned and analyzed survey data to inform their outreach focus. Main reflections included conversations about barriers to bike transportation like lack of safe routes, lack of bike racks etc.

Student Leadership Team Training - 1/15/19, 1/22/19

23 student interns participated in a 2 hour training with Amy Jolly from Center for Climate Protection, focusing on messaging and communicating information about air quality, human health, and climate change.

Air Quality Presentations - 2/7/19, 2/8/19

10 interns created and presented to 100 students in 5 of Dr. LaRue Moore's classes about their survey findings as well as actions to take on and off campus to combat air pollution and climate change in Richmond and San Pablo.

Air Quality and Human Health Professional Speakers - 11/27/18, 1/15/19, 4/23/19

Michael Kent and Luz Gomez (Contra Costa Health Services) presented to student leaders about air quality, human health, and active transportation at 2-hour afterschool meetings. Ben Kaufman (Rails to Trails) presented to students and helped prepare them to educate peers about local bike efforts and transformation occurring to transportation infrastructure throughout Richmond. 10 to 14 student leaders participated in each of the 3 conversations.

Bike Rally with Rich City Rides - 3/18/19

10 student leaders prepared an on-campus bike rally with the help of teachers, administration, and Rich City Rides, to educate students about air quality, bike routes, and local Earn-A-Bike programs. The rally was held at lunch and available to all attendees of Kennedy High. At least 50 students engaged in direct conversations with leadership team.

Data Visualization Installation/ Second Bike Rally - Late April 2019

10 to 23 interns will install an art piece to communicate air quality and particulate matter concentration on campus. This will be paired with a follow up bike rally promoting alternative transportation.

Post-Survey On-Campus Transportation - Late May 2019

23 student interns collect post-data using the same survey conducted in fall to assess attitude and behavior shift throughout the year.
