At SP Library's "The Night of 1001 Inventions" and Downer's "Day of Health & Play", we gave away books related to STEM/health/play, pencils, multi-language reading tips and did Read-Aloud outreach, w/brochures.

Read-Aloud participated in five community events in 2018-19 in which children from ages 5-10 participated, engaged, and discovered new reading material that introduced children to concepts about written language, different genres, and elements of story structure. Parents received helpful strategies and tips on creating games that help build comprehension and language skills.

Stories and comments from Read-Aloud community events:

Friendsgiving:

Crystal and Gabriella read to three sets of age groups during this outreach event. A game of mad libs was introduced in the beginning as an ice breaker in which we all created a funny story as a group. We then broke up into two groups to read stories aloud to children. After reading time, the children picked the books of their choice, a snack, and a free Read-Aloud pencil.

"Look, I got this book. Which one did you get?" 1st grade child told a friend in line.

"I like cat in the hat books" -Kindergartener

"I did not know that!"- 4th grade student said after engaging in facts about an earth book during group reading.

Tree Giving Event:

"You have a good selection of books. We needed some new books at home" -Parent

"I'm going to tell my mom to read this one to me" - 1st grade child commenting on a book they chose.

At this event we were able to re-engage with some of the students that are presently enrolled in the Read-Aloud program at Dover Elementary. They were excited to see Read-Aloud staff in a different setting other than at school. They enjoyed the face painting done by Gabriella Bracamontes who does this as a hobby and the children enjoyed being read to by Crystal Merrill as they waited in line. Parents chose books for their children and enjoyed the holiday selection.

Literacy At Play Workshop:

"I am so glad that your guys are doing this for the community, we need this." -Mother of kindergartener

"I like this game, I didn't know about it. My dad likes it too."- 2nd grade child that enjoyed a game with her father that involved reading and guessing.

S.T.E.A.M workshop:

"I like this book because I like bats" -2nd child. She was excited to see many books her age and a certain book captivated her interest the most.

Downer Playworks event:

At this event, the students at Downer Elementary enjoyed games from Playworks. The Read-Aloud program engaged with families and students in many ways. There were young siblings who attended and enjoyed the coloring books, practicing learning their colors, and getting great books for their age. It was nice to see whole families taking part and interacting with one another. A bilingual parent appreciated the reading tips handout provided at the event. There were many books about animals and children would find their favorite animal, Read-Aloud staff would then read the book aloud to the student.
