II. Program and Event Information

A. Focusing on City of San Pablo Childhood Prevention Task Force: Community Action Plan -

West County READS (WCR) believes that the best way to combat Childhood Obesity is to give children the tools to bring awareness of what "Healthy Literacy" entails. The most important is learning how to read as early in life as possible. WCR encourages family literacy by offering our community books for all generations in a family — from babies to grandparents. One daily habit leading to Healthy Literacy requires being able to read food product information and making healthy choices of what is eaten. This will lower cardiovascular diseases like diabetes, hypertension and metabolic syndrome. Starting lifelong healthy eating habits is the first step to a long, healthy life. WCR enjoys providing books to babies — toddler age because of this purpose.

B. To enhance "Major Policy Goals and/or Strategic Policy Initiative" as identified in the 2018-21 Priority Workplan update. WCR addresses two items in the Workplan. The first is to foster "Multi-cultural Awareness and Appreciation." And the second one is "Services for Families, Seniors and Youth." New bilingual language books and dictionaries were a major focus when purchasing books for the high Latino population in San Pablo. Often when distributing the dictionaries, family members tell us why each generation needs a copy. School age kids use it to do their homework. Parents use it to help the kids do homework and also as a daily reference for themselves. Grandparents often do not focus on learning English, so it helps them to learn the English language. We distribute bilingual books in the hopes that the parents and other family members can read to their children in the home setting in their primary language when English is not fluently familiar. It is important for kids to read or be read to at least 20 minutes each day, whether it's in English, Spanish or any other native language. Older family members are the first teachers in a child's life (parents, siblings, cousins, grandparents, aunts & uncles...). It is important for kids to see that reading in the home is a family priority.

- 2. September 8, 2018 Back To School Closet, Davis Park 284 residents
- 3. October 6, 2018 No. Richmond Pt. Pinole Shoreline Festival approximately 1,400 attendees
- 4. December 20, 2018 Family Giving Tree Holiday Party, Maple Hall 288 residents

At all 4 events WCR distributed a generous supply of new and gently used books, quantities as listed.

The community expressed surprise and appreciation when receiving the new books. They could not believe they were being given these free! Standard practice was to limit distribution early during the event to one new book per person, access to gently used books was unlimited all day until gone. During the 2nd half of the event, attendees were allowed to take more of the new books. This practice is done to conserve new books during the entirety of the event. We gave out 90-100% of all the books brought to the event – new & gently used.
