As the new San Pablo Mayor appointed in December 2019, I wanted to personally congratulate you formally on the success of your decade-long federal legislative process to establish a new, Lytton Tribe homeland, with the successful passing of federal legislation H.R. 1388 (D-Huffman) – “The Lytton Rancheria Act of 2019” which was subsequently part of Senate Bill 1790, “The National Defense Authorization Act for Fiscal Year 2020”. which has been now been approved by the federal government on December 20, 2019.

On behalf of the San Pablo City Council, the City understands how vitally important this federal legislation was to the Lytton Tribe in obtaining the necessary federal support to facilitate future development of the 511 acres for your future Tribal homestead near the Town of Windsor, CA, with development of new civic buildings, housing, hotel/resort, and a winery project to benefit all Lytton tribal families, officials and representatives.
